PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

The purpose of the Prayer Shawl Ministry is to make prayer shawls and/or prayer cloths for anyone who is in need of spiritual comfort, whether due to illness or bereavement, or for celebrations of joy. The shawls/cloths are knitted or crocheted, and instructions are provided. A prayer or blessing is said before the shawl is presented to an individual and a signed card is attached to each shawl explaining its purpose. Prayer cloths are readily available in the hallway outside of the sanctuary. They are more portable than the prayer shawls and can be carried in a pocket or handbag, providing immediate comfort when needed.

New members are always welcome. Although the meetings are a time for fellowship, it is not necessary to attend the meetings in order to participate in the ministry. Projects can be completed at home and brought to the church for prayer or blessing before given to the recipients.
